Pursuant to Federal Rule of Bankruptcy Procedure 9036, rather than delivering orders and court-generated notices to me via U.S. mail, I request that the U.S. Bankruptcy Court deliver those documents to me instead at my email address below via the Bankruptcy Court Noticing Center (BNC), through the U.S. Bankruptcy Court's Debtor Electronic Bankruptcy Noticing (DeBN) program.

I understand that my email address will appear publicly on this request and any certificate of mailing filed by the BNC.

I understand that this request is limited to receipt of only court-generated notices and orders entered by the U.S. Bankruptcy Court. I will continue to receive documents filed by all other parties, such as a trustee or creditors, via U.S. mail or in person pursuant to Federal and local court rules.

I understand that I will receive electronic notice of any documents entered by the U.S. Bankruptcy Court in any current or future bankruptcy case or adversary proceeding from any U.S. Bankruptcy Court district in which I am listed with the same name and email address, including cases where I am listed as a creditor, plaintiff or defendant.

I understand that emails sent by the BNC may arrive in my email spam folder.

I understand that the first time the BNC receives an email bounce-back (undeliverable mail), my DeBN account will be automatically deactivated. I will then receive notices and orders from the U.S. Bankruptcy Court via U.S. mail, and I must file an updated request form if I wish to reactivate my account.

I understand that enrollment in DeBN is completely voluntary, and I may file a request to deactivate my account at any time.

If I already have a different electronic noticing account, I authorize the U.S. Bankruptcy Court to deactivate that account and create this DeBN account.

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
